Ipomoea purpurea

650 sds/oz 70°-75° 8 days

For the best germination, we suggest soaking the seeds for 3-5 days before sowing. After germination, be careful not to overwater or overfeed. Showy annual with climbing vines of easy culture. Will attract hummingbirds all season. Flowers and leaves are edible. CAUTION: SEED AND PARTS OF THE PLANT COULD BE TOXIC IF INGESTED.

180 in. - 800 S. Beautiful 5 in. flowers showing a background of crystal white with sprays, stripes and splashes of sky blue. (The perfect sister to Heavenly Blue). A vigorous strain that can produce vines 15 feet or more.

Formula Mixture - 4085

300-350 S. Spring flowering. This class is midway between the Multiflora Gigantea (winter flowering) and summer types, preferred by most growers for spring greenhouse blooming. Do not sow before October for this purpose. Also widely planted for outdoor use, being a week or two earlier than the summer class and more heat resistant.

GERMANIA FLOWERING

Special Mixture - 4087

300 S. The standard class for outdoor use. Sow in pots or plant bands in late winter and grow cool after germination, set out in early spring as soon as the soil can be worked.
